5. RESPONSIBILITIES:

Soldiers requiring medical attention after the events will be required to go either to the emergency room or sick-call for assistance. Transportation will be available for participants should they need any assistance. Sick-call hours will also be based on the schedule of events, and will be posted in the Welcome Center once the Schedule of Events and times is determined.

(2) 4th Finance: Provide a finance representative from 20-27 October. From 20-22 October, a representative will be available 24 hours a day. From 23-27 October, a representative will be available from 1700-2200 to assist soldiers with any financial problems they may have. Provide support plan.

(3) 4th PSC: Coordinate with the 52d Eng to run the in and out-processing portion of the Welcome Center. A representative will be available during the same hours as the 4th Finance representative. Responsible for the creation of an in-processing sheet. Prepare inprocessing plan.

Annex C (Billeting Responsibilities) to 4TH INFANTRY DIVISION PREPARATION FOR AND CONDUCT OF THE III CORPS TRUCK ROADEO (OPERATION ROAD WARRIOR) 8-30-95

1. Purpose. To provide information and responsibilities related to hosting and supporting billeting for the 1995 III Corps Truck Roadeo.

2. Responsibilities. The 52d Engineer Combat Battalion (Heavy) is assigned overall responsibility for coordination and conduct of billeting within the guidelines of this MOI and the III Corps Commander's intent. The following units are assigned the responsibilities outlined below.

A. 52d ECB (Heavy)

(1) Secure billeting for 400 soldiers for the duration of the event. Billeting will be at the old hospital area (buildings 6245, 6246, 6247) at Fort Carson. Coordination with DRC is required.

(2) Provide a billeting plan. This plan will break down exactly what units are assigned to which of the 11 separate bays in the complex. A section of the barracks will be set aside for female billeting.

(3) Cleaning of the billets before, during, and after the competition. A civilian cleaning agency will be contracted for cleaning of the bays before the event. The competitors will be responsible for daily and final cleaning of the barracks. A cleaning plan consisting of what each unit will clean which part of the barracks will be developed. Expendable cleaning supplies necessary for this will be provided by the 52d ECB (H). Mops, buckets, and buffers will be provided by DRC for the competitors to use. A final inspection of the billets will be done by DRC prior to turning over the barracks.

(4) Provide beds and linen for all soldiers. Each soldier will receive a pillow, sheets, blanket, 1/2 of a bunk bed, and a footlocker. DRC will provide all items to 52d ECB (H). In turn, the 52d ECB(H) will be responsible for issue and turn in of all items to soldiers. A centralized exchange room will be set up for soldiers to draw and turn in linen.

(5) Coordinate for recreational facilities and equipment. Gymnasiums will be made available for competing soldiers. Footballs, volleyballs, and volleyball nets will be available on a sign-out basis in the barracks. Direct coordination with TASC will be required.

(6) Outfit dayroom. Each of the 11 bays has one small porch area to be used as a day room. One other large office will be set up as the main day room. Coordination will be made for TVs VCRs, Fussball tables, pool tables, couches, and vending machines for these rooms. Direct coordination with TASC, AAFES, and DPCA will be required.

(7) Updating maintenance of billets. An inspection of the old hospital will be done to determine whether adequate shower, laundry, and bathroom facilities exist. If deemed not adequate, repairs will be made, and additional facilities will be coordinated for.

ANNEX C (BILLETING) TO 4TH INFANTRY DIVISION PREPARATION FOR AND CONDUCT OF THE III CORPS TRUCK ROADEO (OPERATION ROAD WARRIOR) 8-30-95

(8) A concession stand will be set up by the 52d ECB (H) in the barracks. Candy, soda, hot dogs, newspapers, and other small items will be sold at low cost.

(9) Set-up of phone system in barracks. Existing phone lines in the billeting area will be used for local calls. 18 additional pay phones will be coordinated for through AT&T, and set up outside the complex.

(10) Providing comfort items. Additional "nice to have" items, such as soap, shower shoes, complementary snacks, etc., will be coordinated for and provided to soldiers. Direct coordination with AAFES is required.

(11) Administrative Operations Center: Will be manned 24 hours a day. A plan for manning a SDNCO duty station each night of the exercise will be made. NCOs from all BNs in the 43D ASG will be used. A duty book will be made to inform the SDNCOs of their duties, and what to do in case of emergencies. The Admin Ops Center is responsible for the following:

- a. Life support of billeting area.
- b. Inprocessing participants.
- c. Assigning soldiers to a dining facility.
- d. Administrative support to participants.

B. 759th MP. Assumes overall responsibility for physical security of the barracks. This will include, but not be limited to: initial inspection of billets for physical security condition, having a roving MP patrol at the barracks, and establishing emergency EOC procedures. A complete physical security plan must be turned in to 52d ECB (H) by 20 SEP. On order provide security for arms room.

(3) A two hour turnaround time is slated for each shuttle bus (soldiers will not wait more than two hour at any one particular shuttle stop before they are picked up by the next bus).

(4) The last shuttle bus will leave Ft Carson at 0030 hrs nightly. There will be a standby/oncall shuttle van if soldiers become stranded after hours.

(5) Shuttle stops include: Mission Trace Shopping Center, Hancock Plaza, Carmike Cinemas, Citadel Crossing, Citadel Mall, Comedy Corner, Cowboys, Memorial Park, Downtown Colorado Springs and Old Colorado City.

d. Distinguished Visitors Bureau:

(1) The DVB OIC/NCOIC is responsible for controlling all drivers and transportation assets assigned to the DVB.

(2) Four VIP vans (7 pax) and 3 VIP sedans will be issued to the DVB for transportation support. Two additional VIP vans will be held in reserve for emergency use.

(3) Additional transportation assets will be requested through the 43rd ASG Transportation section. Drivers (additional vehicle requests) will be requested through the 43rd ASG Tasking section.

e. Reception Station:

(1) The 43rd ASG Transportation OIC will be responsible for providing transportation of all Truck Rodeo participants to and from the airport, competitive activities, dining facilities and MWR activities.

(2) Three vans with drivers will be assigned to the Reception Station OIC/NCOIC in the event of an emergency transportation need.

ANNEX F (PROTOCOL) TO 4TH INFANTRY DIVISION PREPARATION FOR AND CONDUCT OF THE III CORPS TRUCK ROADEO (OPERATION ROAD WARRIOR) 8-30-95

1. REFERENCES. See Operation Order.

2. GENERAL. Fort Carson will host the III Corps Truck Rodeo, 23 - 27 October 1995. The following is guidance in establishing the Distinguished Visitors Bureau, (DVB).

a. The DVB will receive O6 Commanders, their Command Sergeants Major, and higher distinguished visitors and civilian equivalent in Building 9601, Room 204, at the Aviation Maintenance Facility adjacent to the Rodeo Operations Center, (Room 205).

b. The DVB will be manned so that all visitors can receive basic information, schedules of events, bus schedules, etc.

c. Hours of operation will be 0730-1800 daily.

3. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS. Visitors will be received at the DVB. All visitors will receive a schedule of activities and a map. Visitors in the rank of Brigadier General and higher will receive itineraries published by Protocol, and be met by their escort officer, who will provide assistance throughout their visit. Escorts will also be provided to Division Command Sergeants Major. An area will be available for visitors to use telephone, facsimile or electronic mail.

5. TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

A. 43rd AREA SUPPORT GROUP.

(1) Provide overall organization and planning for the DVB, along with oversight and assistance during the Truck Rodeo.

(2) Plan for sufficient manpower to conduct daily DVB operations.

(3) Plan for sufficient TMP or rental vehicle support for DV.

(4) Provide initial brief for DVB escorts on responsibilities and expected standards.

(5) Provide one Captain to perform duties as OIC DVB.

(6) Provide junior officers (Lieutenant or Captain) and senior NCO's as required to perform duties as escort officers.

(7) Provide one NCO (SGT or SSG) and one junior soldier to greet visitors, monitor activity and provide support at the DVB.

(8) Provide 15 hand-held radios with charger for use by escorts and the DVB OIC.

B. EXECUTIVE SERVICES.

- (1) Provide invitations to distinguished visitors.
- (2) Publish itineraries for distinguished visitors, (BG and higher, and Division CSM).
- (3) Develop schedule for distinguished visitors and provide to DVB OIC.
- (4) Provide seating charts and place cards as necessary for CG sponsored or hosted events.

C. 52d ENGINEERS. Provide 50 welcome packets with basic information, event and bus schedules to the DVB OIC.

D. 68th SUPPORT BATTALION.

- (1) Provide schedule of events along with any changes to the DVB OIC.
- (2) Provide map of events, (to include any changes) along with special information concerning routes, locations for DV parking.
- (3) Designate greeters to meet and brief visitors at the event location. Be prepared to provide DV service on short notice.
- (4) Provide scoring updates to the DVB OIC daily or at the conclusion of any event.
- (5) Provide the name and telephone number where the DVB OIC can call to give advance notification of a DV enroute to an event.
- (6) Provide Lieutenants and Sergeant Majors as escort officers.

E. DVB OIC:

- (1) Conduct DVB daily operations.
- (2) Coordinate daily schedules of distinguished visitors (DV), escorts, event briefings, vehicles and drivers, and daily events with guidance from Protocol.
- (3) Attend the escort officer briefing with protocol 2 working days prior to the start of the Truck Rodeo. Confirm names of escorts and their escort assignments with protocol.

- (4) Post schedule of events along with any changes in the DVB.
- (5) Post map of events, (to include any changes) along with special information concerning routes, locations for DV parking.
- (6) Coordinate use of radios, vehicles and drivers between DV escorts.
- (7) Post scoring updates in the DVB daily or at the conclusion of any event.
- (8) Maintain a list of POC's for each on the ground event POC.
- (9) Monitor daily operations at the DVB and prepare DVB for formal VIP briefings.

F. ESCORT OFFICERS/ SGM's.

- (1) Perform duties in accordance with standards briefed by the DVB OIC.
- (2) Provide advance notice to the event POC when you are enroute to their location.
- (3) Contact DVB OIC twice daily, (or more often if needed) for schedule changes, scores, assignments, and messages.

1. SITUATION. See Basic Order.

2. MISSION.

a. The 43d ASG subordinate units will provide food service support to all customer and transient units involved in the III Corps Truck Rodeo from 21 October 95 to 28 October 95.

b. The 1st Bde and 3rd BDE 4ID will provide food service support for 250 or more participating soldiers for morning and evening meals from 21 through 28 October 95.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of the Operation. The 1st and 3rd Bde's will be responsible for the consolidated dining facilities. Breakfast and supper will be served in the dining facilities. The noon meal will be carried out on location of the actual competition. The 43d ASG will be responsible for providing food service personnel to assist the 1st and 3rd Bde's. One dining facility will be used for 250 or less soldiers. Two dining facilities will be used if participants exceed 250 in number.

b. 3rd BDE 4ID will be responsible for providing morning and evening meals for participating soldiers. The 3rd BDE will provide support for all participants if the numbering participants do not exceed 250 soldiers. The 1st Bde will provide the additional dining facility if the participants exceed 250 soldiers.

c. Tasks to Subordinate Units.

(1) 68th CSB will confirm the headcount to WO1 Thomas before the first day of operations.

(2) Commanders will provide their normal complement of food service personnel to the dining facility.

(3) Commanders be prepared to lose personnel in support of the noontime meal.
